# The Bishops of Ohio Announce the Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

May 13, 2021

"Together, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday/Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated (CIC, can. 1247). This will take effect in each of the Dioceses of Ohio the weekend of June 5-6. 2021. As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181). This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immunocompromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons. Nevertheless, these persons should observe the Lord's Day (CIC, can. 1247) and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an appropriate way to do this is through viewing a broadcast of the Sunday Mass. Masses that are broadcast through various media are not intended as a substitute nor do they fulfill the obligation for the persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days of Obligation. Instead, they are intended for the sick, home-bound, the imprisoned, etc., who are unable to attend Mass in person. Kindly consult your pastor with any specific questions regarding the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation."

# Worship Aid for June 5—6

Things to note during restrictions due to Covid:

- Please take this bulletin with you! Do not leave it in the pews. We will then sanitize before the next Mass.

# **First Reading** Exodus 24:3-8 (168B) A reading from the Book of Exodus

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the Lord, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the Lord has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the Lord and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain as altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain

young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the Lord, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do." Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words of his."

**Second Reading**A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews 9:11-15

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

# Updates on Covid Restrictions per Bishops of Ohio/ DOY

The Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days is to be reinstated on June 5—6, 2021. The following revised Directives and Guidance for Public Liturgies is issued following the latest revised directives from the CDC and State of Ohio:

Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is compromised or ill, are exempt from attending Mass as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of people. Please see the Directives issued May 18, 2021 for more information.

Otherwise, every effort should be made to return to full and active participation of worship while maintaining a reasonably safe and comfortable environment. To that end, the following are implemented as of 6/5/21:

- Those who are fully vaccinated (meaning have had their second dose and have had two weeks pass without symptoms) are no longer required to wear facial coverings or maintain social distance while at worship.
- Those who have not received full immunization as of yet are asked to maintain social distances and continue to wear masks.
- All seating restrictions have been removed.
- Hymnals, choirs, and singing may resume.
- The Procession of Gifts may resume, with appropriate covering of the host and wine.

There are two continuing restrictions at this time:

- The Sign of Peace will continue to be spoken invitation with a bow, nod or similar gesture.
   We're discouraged from shaking hands or embracing.
- The reception of the Precious Blood from the Chalice remains suspended.

Pastors are encouraged to reassess the needs of their parish community over the coming weeks.

Beginning immediately, the following changes will be noted:

- At this time, pews are still separated for social distancing. Please leave the ropes as indicated.
- Kneelers have been reinstalled.
- Missals will be available in the pews.

What doesn't change is that you are still required to use sanitizer when entering the church, masks will still be required for those not fully immunized, distancing is still requested (so no embracing or shaking of hands during the sign of peace) and current Holy Communion practice will remain the same.

# ST. ANTHONY/ALL SAINTS Pastoral Council Meeting of March 22, 2021 — via Zoom

#### Discussion of Recent Activities in the Parish

Fr. Tom stated that First Reconciliation was celebrated as well as preparation class for Confirmation which made for a busy weekend. The children finished their journals which help them learn the prayers and the gifts of the Holy Spirit, answer questions about their faith journey, and help them decipher what they expect to get out of their journey. Fr. Tom is always impressed with the good job that the children do in expressing their faith at that level. Stations of the Cross have been done by way of Facebook, and we are looking ahead to Palm Sunday the upcoming weekend. The Sunday Mass attendance has been increasing slowly. Parishioners who have gotten vaccinated are feeling more comfortable now in returning to the weekend liturgies.

#### **Report of Conseio Activities**

Deacon Alfredo stated that there are 5 Hispanic candidates of the RCIA program who have been preparing to receive the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil this year. Some of them are couples who have a willingness and a desire to go through the next process of marriage prep. He stated that there is a long-term desire in their hearts to get married through the Church. It basically takes them a year and a half to prepare and go through the RCIA program. There hasn't been a formal Consejo meeting in a while. They have met by way of Zoom at a 3-night Lenten Retreat event. Deacon Alfredo added that the participation for the Retreat is with the same people from the leadership formation program at Walsh University. The same ladies are leading the Lenten Retreat titled, From the Darkness into the Light. Cristina Hernandez has been handling the Stations of the Cross on Friday afternoons and reciting the Holy Rosary on Monday's both livestreamed online by way of Facebook.

#### Report from Fr. Tom

Fr. Tom reported that they took a field trip over to St. Louis Parish in Louisville to observe the work being done inside the Church by Henninger's. He shared photos they took of the progress at St. Louis Parish with the Council members. The same company is planning to begin work in our parish the Monday after Easter. They will remove the Stations of the Cross to have them be restored at their facility in Cleveland. Other statues will be taken down safely and properly stored during the

renovations. Scaffolding will go up in the back half of the Church, first, so as not to hinder our upcoming celebrations of Confirmation. In that respect, they will begin work in the loft area, then they will switch the scaffolding to the front area. They are planning to work Monday through Thursday and will clean up their work areas before our weekend Mass liturgies. Fr. Tom stated that he thinks a light blue ceiling would be nice in our parish so as to give the effect of the sky, and the walls would be a similar color to what we already have.

Fr. Tom stated that all the Dean's had a face-to-face meeting with Bishop Bonnar where he reviewed his Pastoral Letter which was printed in the Catholic Exponent and can be found on the Diocesan website as a PDF. In his letter, Bishop Bonnar mentions that he would like to do a Deanery Needs Assessment for each Deanery in order that all the parishes of the Deanery can engage in the needs of their own community. The Bishop understands that different parts of the Diocese have different needs and those actual needs can be identified and addressed through collaboration with Catholic Charities. So each parish will be asked to form a Needs Assessment Committee which will meet and share ideas together at a Deanery meeting to which that data compiled will eventually be submitted for the Bishop's Also at that same Dean's meeting, it was reaffirmed that the Pastoral Regions Plan, promulgated by Bishop Murry that were put on hold due to the Covid pandemic, are still on the table.

#### **Additional business**

Deacon Alfredo recognized Cristina Hernandez's efforts in the preparation of the Lenten Retreat for the Hispanics, and in acquiring the ladies from the Walsh Leadership Saturday, July 24 group to be a part of its success.

#### **Pastoral Council Homework**

Tim Spitale assigned an article from the Knights of Columbus website regarding Building the Domestic Church. Also Fr. Tom stated that the Bishop's Pastoral Letter should be our future homework as well so as to work with it and pray with it.
