



Dear Parish Family,

As you celebrate this Fourth of July weekend with family and friends, I wish you a Happy Independence Day. We celebrate the birth of our nation with time together enjoying cookouts, picnics, and fireworks. This year it will be good to be with others on this important holiday we enjoy each summer. The summer break from school and opportunities for time off to enjoy the nice hot weather are here for the next eight or nine weeks.

Summer break and summer vacations doesn't mean that people aren't working. Most years things slow down a bit with many traveling and enjoying time away, but we still celebrate Mass and the sacraments, and plan and carry out varies ministries. Things to note during restrictions due to Covid:

### Changes to how we receive Communion

### ST. ANTHONY/ALL SAINTS Pastoral Council Meeting of April 26, 2021

### Discussion of Recent Activities in the Parish

<u>Fr. Tom</u> stated that the scaffolding is up now in the Church. The workers have been scraping, sanding and repairing the cracks. They have a lot of prep work to do before they begin painting. We had a retreat for our First Communion students and prior to that was the retreat for our Confirmation students. On April 27th and April 28th, Confirmation was held for 17 students of our parish family. Having it held on 2 nights allowed for better spacing and family attendance. On the weekend of May 1—2, students of our parish family made their First Holy Communion. <u>Fr. Tom</u> stated that he will also be serving Confirmation at St. Mary St. Benedict Parish. An old design from the past was uncovered this week beneath layers of plaster during the repair work. A picture was taken and posted to our Facebook page. It was discovered on the wall towards the back of the Church. The paint colors we are planning to use will be a white wall and a different shade of white on the beams with a light shade of blue on the ceiling. <u>Deacon Alfredo</u> stated that he received an invite from Deacon Mike from the Diaconate Program to give a presentation of Diversity and Inclusion to the aspirants by way of Zoom.

### **Report of Consejo Activities**

<u>Fr. Tom</u> stated that there has not been a formal meeting. <u>Cristina Hernandez</u> and <u>Sr. Karen</u> are working with several Hispanic families with acquiring food and so forth. <u>Sr. Karen</u> is still uncomfortable going on a Pilgrimage this year due to the pandemic and because they usually go by way of bus. She is planning to have Summer school with the children of Preschool age thru Kindergarten age. She has been given a grant from the Sisters of Charity to help out. <u>Cristina Hernandez</u> has found spaces for those in the community who still need the vaccine in both the Canton and Massillon areas. She stated that close to 200 of them have already been vaccinated. On May 18<sup>th</sup> the Health Department opened 100 spaces for the Hispanics who still need the vaccination. There were 85 in attendance at the Hispanic Sunday liturgy.

### Report from Fr. Tom

Fr. Tom reported that he and Msgr. Gaetano (Dean of Stark East) have scheduled a meeting on May 12<sup>th</sup> with the Stark County pastors of each parish. This was requested by Bishop Bonnar as part of his Pastoral Plan of a Deanery Needs Assessment in which 5-7 members of each parish form a committee. Each committee from every parish will determine the needs of the people within their communities, such as tutoring, housing, food, etc. that should be addressed. All those ideas will then be shared and whittled down to about 3 or more projects that could realistically be done. They will then be turned in to the Bishop and teamed up and coordinated with Catholic Charities. This will be an opportunity for clusters of parishes to evangelize and serve as we are called to do. This may be of interest to our young people who prefer to do things more hands on. Fr. Tom stated that we still need a plan for our region that we began about a year ago but then was put on hold due to the passing of Bishop Murry and the pandemic. The personnel board of the Diocese is operating on the promulgated plans from Bishop Murry. Fr. Tom did send out an email to all pastors and parish leaders in our region about commencing a meeting to get this underway again. We currently have 69 active priests in our Diocese, 3 of whom will be retiring this summer and 2 who will be ordained. Plans are underway to celebrate our Feast Day this year following the guidelines of the CDC, the Governor's office and the Bishop's office. We plan to have a Mass under the tent with proper spacing, a procession around the block, adoration inside the Church, a raffle and the use of food trucks. Kelli Karns called the Mayor's office and was told that we do not need a permit for the food trucks but that each individual truck has to be registered with the city and have their own permit. We might be able to have Rennick Road closed and be able to rent Church space to each food truck. Kelli contacted a friend who has a food truck to ask him for advice. The suggestion was made to begin contacting the food trucks as soon as possible so our event doesn't coincide with other events. Tim Spitale suggested that we check with our own parishioners first who have restaurants so that they may be given an opportunity to benefit.

### Additional business

<u>Fr. Tom</u> stated that he was contacted by the Diocese and told that Deacon Brian Smith, who will be ordained in June, will be moving into the Rectory. The Diocese gave Deacon Brian a project for Seminary that involves Hispanic ministry so he will gain firsthand experience here at the parish. He will be staying until his ordination date in June.

### **Pastoral Council Homework**

<u>Tim Spitale</u> assigned an article from the U.S. Catholic publication: Pope Francis calls for an age of mercy. Tim also asked the members to consider any youth whom they think would be a good candidate for the committee for the Deanery Needs Assessment.


